



Wisp

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Difficulty

Beginner

Finished measurements

Approximately 5 inches [13cm]
wide / 84 inches [213cm] long

Materials

[MC] 1 skein of bulky novelty yarn (shown: Milkyrobot Girls Throw Snow, super-bulky handspun, 40 yards[36m])

[CC] 1 skein coordinating fingering yarn (shown: Sandes Garn Sisu, 173 yards[158m] per 50g, colour 1042)

1 US #17/12.75mm circular needle

Tapestry needle

Gauge

Not really important and difficult to measure

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Pattern

Using MC, CO 12.

Work in garter st for a few rows. Attach CC and work a row or two.

Continue working in garter st alternating yarns somewhat randomly. To make the ends heavier and to get more oomph from the handspun, I recommend using more handspun towards the ends.

Work the final few rows in MC, and BO when you run out of yarn or like the length of your scarf.
